

1. A Club member may register a vehicle under the Historic Vehicle Scheme (HSV) or the Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS). Vehicles registered under the HVS or CVS may only be used in accordance with the Club Constitution and By- Laws and applicable (Transport for NSW) regulations.

2. Participation in Club events – Responsibility of members. Vehicle registration on Conditional Registration Schemes (HVS and CVS) is granted on the understanding that the members' prime intended use of the vehicle is for club events and personal recreational purposes. The Club Registrar or Executive have the right to reconsider eligibility to approve registration renewal should this cease to be the case or if a member fails to meet the Club Membership Requirements as set out in the By-Laws. The Executive has the discretion to refuse or accept an application for Conditional Vehicle Registration prior to a Probationary Member becoming a Full Member. To apply this clause the Executive shall review any application for the Conditional Registration of a Probationary Member's vehicle(s).

3. Members who require registration under the (HVS or CVS) scheme for a vehicle of 30 years or older for the first time must obtain from an Authorised Examiner a Transport for NSW Blue Slip and for every following annual registration a Transport for NSW Pink Slip must be obtained from an Authorised Examiner. Members under either of the registration schemes must keep a current log book for Car Club events/runs which will be subject to inspection at any time including at annual registration.

4. Members who have vehicles on conditional registration under the HVS or CVS schemes must be financial members and adhere to the Club Constitution and By- Laws. If a member is not financial then the vehicle is classed as non-compliant.

5. Historic vehicles must be as close to original condition as possible with no alteration except for safety features such as seat belts and turn indicators or period accessories (HVS). If the vehicle is modified and does not pass inspection by an Authorised Examiner the owner must obtain an Engineers Certificate for modifications then a Blue Slip prior to registration (CVS).

6. A member requiring Vehicle registration under the HVS or CVS schemes must comply with the requirements of Transport for NSW in respect to residency and garaging of the vehicle.

7. The Historic vehicle declaration form must be stamped and signed by the Club Registrar (HVS) and approved Organisation (CVS) prior to final registration with Transport for NSW.

8. Any vehicle which is already on (HVS or CVS) plates and the registration has expired for more than three months, will also require a Blue Slip prior to re registration.
